RECYCLING

Official Notice: To Residents and Businesses of Millstone Township

Recycling is mandated by the State, County and Municipal Statutes.

Millstone Township must continue to recycle to meet aggressive recycling goals set by the State and County. As the Deputy Recycling Coordinator of the Township, my responsibility is to continue to strive to meet those goals by aggressively enforcing Township ordinances. Random inspections within the Township resulted in citations being issued for lack of compliance with Chapter 19, SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT, of the Revised General Ordinances, Township of Millstone. Some brief passages from this section follow:

"It shall be mandatory for all persons, who are owners, lessees, or occupants of residential property, to separate newspapers, glass bottles and jars, tin and bi-metal cans, plastic containers, aluminum cans, corrugated cardboard and electronics as hereafter defined from all other solid waste produced by such residence for collection and ultimate recycling of materials.

Solid waste: Solid waste shall mean and include all garbage and rubbish normally produced by the occupants of commercial, industrial and residential property and disposed of by private or public pick-up.

Proof of collection service: Proof of collection service shall mean a written record, log, bill or document evidencing receipt of service for the collection of solid waste for the preceding month from a person lawfully engaging in private solid waste collection services within the Township.

Violations and penalties: Any person, firm or corporation who violates or neglects to comply with any provision of this section or any rule or regulation promulgated pursuant thereto, shall be liable to the penalty stated in Chapter I, Section 1-5. (Fines could be as much as \$2,000.00 for non-compliance).

Note: Court appearance may be required for summons.

I urge you to continue to do your part in keeping Millstone Township clean and to show that we are an "Environmentally Concerned Community".


NEWSPAPERS

Newspapers and any inserts that come with the paper. DO NOT INCLUDE ANY NEWSPAPER USED FOR PET WASTE OR HOUSEHOLD PROJECTS



CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

Waffle section between layers. DO NOT INCLUDE: FOOD CONTAMINATED CARDBOARD (e.g. pizza boxes) OR WAXED CARDBOARD. Break down boxes.



MIXED PAPER

Includes: letterhead, colored and white paper, junk mail, soft cover books, chip-board (e.g. cereal boxes). DO NOT INCLUDE: FOOD WRAPPERS, PAPER CUPS OR PLATES OR ANY OTHER PRODUCT USED FOR FOOD OR PERSONAL HYGIENE. NO HARDCOVER BOOKS (UNLESS COVER & BINDER IS REMOVED)



LEAVES AND GRASS CLIPPINGS

DO NOT DISPOSE WITH HOUSEHOLD TRASH. Grass clippings can be left on the lawn, added to compost piles, or brought to special drop-off at county landfill (for a fee)



CAR BATTERIES & MOTOR OIL-RECHARGEABLE & BUTTON BATTERIES

Car batteries can be brought to a scrap yard. Motor oil can be brought to the County HHW facility or local service stations. Most common household batteries (A, AA, AAA, C, D, 9 Volt) can be disposed in regular trash. However, rechargeable batteries should be brought to retail store drop offs (check www.rbrc for locations), and silver "button batteries" should be returned to retail or county sponsored drop offs

Conversations at Holiday Time

A staggering fact is that alcohol is responsible for almost 5,000 deaths of underage youth each year. This is even more true around this time of year. Did you know that, on any day in the month of December, more than 11,000 young people will use alcohol for the first time? Holiday time is when families get together to celebrate the season and each other. It may also provide you, as a parent, a chance to spend more quality time with your children than usual. Why is that important? Because it may be the only time you'll get to discuss your position on the use of alcohol and drugs.

This is a community-wide issue and so it is going to take a community to solve it. So how do we as teachers, parents, coaches, role models in our community help? Here are a few ideas:

Start a conversation.

- Look for the right time to have that talk with them. Maybe it centers around this time of year or maybe you focus it around prom time, or entering high school, or their first party. Look for that moment when a teen would be more open to a conversation.
- Fight the urge to lecture about all the scary stories you have heard about underage drinking and just listen instead. Ask their opinions and thoughts on the topic. Pay attention to what kids are doing to celebrate the holidays.
- Teach teens that they should be celebrating the holidays with people they can trust and that they do not HAVE to drink or give in to the pressures that this holiday season often brings.
- Nothing is more powerful than a teen hearing it from another teen so if you have that ability to have a friend, classmate, or sibling join in the conversation then take it, it is priceless.
- It all comes down to the point that we know so much more about the dangers of underage drinking then we did even a few years ago. Do the research, know your facts, and talk to the kids in your life often about it. Have a conversation before the holiday parties hit and give your kids the best tools to keep themselves safe this month and always.
- If your son or daughter has been away at school, they will certainly have been exposed to dangerous drinking behavior and maybe drug use — even if they did not participate themselves. This is the perfect time to catch up with your child and re-establish your position on alcohol and other drug use. But first, practice the conversation ahead of time. You may have to have a couple of “practice runs”. Make sure you talk it over with your spouse/partner beforehand. It will help you keep a level head and speak to the issue.

Make sure you know the facts.

- These conversations are not easy but they are worthwhile. There are many resources available to you. The Millstone Alliance to Prevent Substance Abuse is only one of them. Check out our section on the Millstone Township website for others.

Make a plan.

- You and your spouse/partner should tell yourselves that you won't “lose it” with your child. Anger and hostility won't get you anywhere in this conversation. Stay as calm as possible. Remember, you are the parent and you are in charge. Be kind, simple, and direct in your statements to your child. Above all, remember to tell your son or daughter that you love them! The conversation will not be perfect — no conversation ever is. Know that you are doing the right thing for your child. That's what matters most!

Keep your family safe.

- Teens are spending more time on their own after school, during school holidays like winter and spring break, and over the summer. They spend less than a small percentage of their waking hours actually in school and, at home, more households include a single parent juggling all of the responsibilities or both parents working full-time jobs. While teens might be enjoying all of their free time, research shows that young people with unsupervised time are three times more likely to use marijuana or other drugs. And unsupervised teens are more likely to engage in risky behaviors such as underage drinking, sexual activity, and cigarette smoking than other teens.
- You can still keep an eye on them, however, and know what they are doing during these unsupervised periods. As long as you set clear rules, monitor their activities (through technology, friends, neighbors, and appointed check-in times), and plan ahead, you can help keep your children safe and out of trouble.
