Avakian, Inc., dated October 2017. Formal Action May Be Taken. Plan considered. Suggested changes were discussed. Updated Draft Plan to be considered at the 11-8-17 Meeting.

Board of Adjustment 10-25-17 Meeting

Resolution: Z17-07 Millstone Donuts, LLC. - Block 18, Lot 2.01 located at 700 Highway 33 consisting of 4.057 Acres in the Planned Commercial Development (PCD) Zone. Applicant sought to install a 30 s.f. drive-thru window addition to the existing retail building. Applicant sought Amended Use Variance, Preliminary and Final Major Site Plan approval. “What’s in *your* child’s room?” is not a question that parents should take lightly. On Thursday December 14th, the Millstone Alliance to Prevent Substance Abuse will present an interactive program to educate parents, educators and community members about the latest drug trends. The setting is a mock teen bedroom for adults to explore and empower parents to address potential risky behaviors by their children. Audience participants walk through the bedroom display doing their best to spot items where alcohol or other drugs can be stashed, or to spot other red flags such as clothing, posters, etc. that have pro-drug

messages. All of the items can easily be purchased on the internet or local stores that target a teen audience.

The intention of this program is not to scare parents, but to provide knowledge, awareness and support during the teenage years. Hidden in Plain Sight is presented by DEA Special Agent Tim McMahon, who has delivered this program across the state in recent months. His goal in working with the Millstone Alliance, is to explore ways that parents can become more aware of the signs that their child might be experimenting with alcohol or other drugs. It is a powerful way for law enforcement, parents and the community to all work together to encourage youth to make positive life choices.

The program will also cover recent drug trends and local statistics, as well as provide local resources for parents who may suspect their child has begun to experiment.

RECYCLING

Official Notice: To Residents and Businesses of Millstone Township

Recycling is mandated by the State, County and Municipal Statutes.

Millstone Township must continue to recycle to meet aggressive recycling goals set by the State and County. As the Recycling Coordinator of the Township, my responsibility is to continue to strive to meet those goals by aggressively enforcing Township ordinances. Random inspections within the Township resulted in citations being issued for lack of compliance with Chapter 19, SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT, of the Revised General Ordinances, Township of Millstone. Some brief passages from this section follow:

It shall be mandatory for all persons, who are owners, lessees, or occupants of residential property, to separate newspapers, glass bottles and jars, tin and bi-metal cans, plastic containers, aluminum cans, corrugated cardboard and electronics as hereafter defined from all other solid waste produced by such residence for collection and ultimate recycling of materials.

Solid Waste: Solid waste shall mean and include all garbage and rubbish normally produced by the occupants of commercial, industrial and residential property and disposed of by private or public pick-up.

Proof of Collection Service: Proof of collection service shall mean a written record, log, bill or document evidencing receipt of service for the collection of solid waste for the preceding month from a person lawfully engaging in private solid waste collection services within the Township.

Violations and Penalties: Any person, firm or corporation who violates or neglects to comply with any provision of this section or any rule or regulation promulgated pursuant thereto, shall be liable to the penalty stated in Chapter I, Section 1-5. (Fines could be as much as \$2,000.00 for non-compliance).

Note: **Court appearance may be required for summons.**

I urge you to continue to do your part in keeping Millstone Township clean and to show that we are an "Environmentally Concerned Community".

What is in Our Garbage?

Paper	43%

The average person throws away 4 pounds of garbage per day

RECYCLE means to process old, used items in order that the material can be used to make new products. Examples of things that are often recycled are glass bottles and jars, plastic bottles, newspapers, aluminum cans and mixed papers.

REDUCE refers to lessening the amount of items or resources that are consumed, using only the amount that is needed, and looking for alternatives that will lessen our use.

REUSE means extending the 'life' or reusing an item rather than discarding or throwing it away.

What is SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING?

Single Stream Recycling allows all recyclable materials (clean paper, plastic bottles, tin, steel and aluminum containers) to be placed in one container for collection. Many recycling processing plants have installed additional and more sophisticated equipment to handle single stream recyclables.

Single Stream Recycling reduces collection costs, permitting use of single-compartment trucks and automated handling of fewer, larger containers. Reduced sorting encourages residents' participation and may generate more materials. However, increased processing costs reduce the value of the collected materials and, without clear guidelines for those generating the recyclables, may increase contamination by unsuitable and food-contaminated products (more residual waste created during processing).

MANDATED RECYCLABLES



Bottles & Cans
Aluminum Cans: DO NOT INCLUDE FOIL, PIE TINS, TRAYS, COOKWARE
Tin & Bi-Metal Cans Glass Bottles & Jars: DO NOT INCLUDE DISHWARE, LIGHT BULBS, CERAMICS, WINDOW GLASS, MIRRORS
Plastic "Pourable Containers": Neck of bottle smaller than body, #1 #2 ONLY Remove Caps.
 Be careful to completely empty any container used for automotive fluids. Any leftover chemicals in containers can be disposed (call 732- 683-8686 for appointment) at the Household Hazardous Waste Facility



Leaves and Grass Clippings
 DO NOT DISPOSE WITH HOUSEHOLD TRASH. Grass clippings can be left on the lawn, added to compost piles, or brought to special drop-off at county landfill (for a fee).



Car Batteries & Motor Oil
 Car batteries can be brought to a scrap yard. Motor Oil can be brought to Monmouth County's at the Household Hazardous Waste Facility (call 732- 683-8686 for appointment) or local service stations.




Newspapers
Newspapers and any inserts that come with the paper. DO NOT INCLUDE ANY NEWSPAPER USED FOR PET WASTE OR HOUSEHOLD PROJECTS

Most common household batteries (A, AA, AAA, C, D, 9 Volt) can be disposed in regular trash. However, rechargeable batteries should be brought to retail store drop offs (check www.rbrcc for locations). Silver "button batteries" should be returned to municipal or county sponsored drop offs. Millstone Township's Municipal Building located at 470 Stage Coach Road has a receiving bin for "button batteries" only, NO OTHER BATTERY TYPES WILL BE ACCEPTED.



Corrugated Cardboard
Waffle section between layers. DO NOT INCLUDE FOOD CONTAMINATED CARD- BOARD (e.g. pizza boxes) OR WAXED CARD- BOARD. Flatten boxes.



Bulky Recyclables
Tree Parts (stumps, limbs larger than 3 inches in diameter)
Concrete & Asphalt
Scrap Metals (including small metal appliances, window frames, etc.)



Mixed Paper
Includes: letterhead, colored and white paper, junk mail, soft cover books, chipboard (e.g. cereal boxes). DO NOT INCLUDE FOOD WRAPPERS, PAPER CUPS OR PLATES OR ANY OTHER PRODUCT USED FOR FOOD OR PERSONAL HYGIENE. NO HARDCOVER BOOKS (UNLESS COVER & BINDER IS REMOVED)



Computers and Televisions Disposal prohibited by 2010 State Law. Free drop off available at County Recycling Locations or during Township sponsored Electronic Drop off events.
