Approval of Meeting Minutes: February 12, 2014

Resolutions:

P13-13 Millstone Property Investments, LLC. – Block 16, Lots 11.01, 11.02 and 11.03. Located at 1 Prodelin Way consisting of 9.87 acres located in the HC Zone. Applicant received approval to construct a one-story 9,900 square foot day care center along with a 6,000 square foot one-story office and storage building on 6-13-2007 and was granted a one-year extension of time through 6-13-2011. Applicant returned to the Board for an Amended Prelim. Site Plan approval to include access through Monroe Township and received same in Resolution dated 5-11-11. Applicant returned to the Board for and received Final Site Plan Approval.

The 1830 Historic Thomas Baird Homestead

The Friends' of Millstone Township Historic Registered Properties have been busy. This past year has been spent primarily on interior restoration and site improvements. Walls have been repaired and repainted. The Monmouth County Historical Commission has awarded the Friends a grant for repair of the kitchen roof. Water lines for the old barn and carriage house have been installed. Foundations will be poured as soon as weather permits. A new well has been dug and site preparations made for the windmill. Preparations have been made for an addition to the existing barn, for office, storages, and ADA restrooms. Diseased and dangerous trees have been removed, and new trees planted. This year work can begin on foundation plantings and gardens. And finally, we will begin to utilize this lovely and historic place for educational programs. We look forward to partnering with the Middle School, Master Gardeners, and the Agriculture Extension Service to present timely topics with historic background.

Prevent Diabetes

Studies have found that moderate weight loss and exercise can prevent or delay type 2 diabetes among adults.

A major federally funded study of 3,234 people showed that people can delay and possibly prevent the disease by losing a small amount of weight (5 to 7 percent of total body weight) through 30 minutes of physical activity 5 days a week and healthier eating.

Anyone aged 45 years or older should consider getting tested for diabetes, especially if you are overweight. If you are younger than 45, but are overweight and have one or more additional risk factors which increase the likelihood of developing diabetes, they are:

- Being overweight or obese, which keeps your body from making and using insulin properly and can also cause high blood pressure
- Having a parent, brother or sister with diabetes
- Being African American, American Indian, Asian American, Pacific Islander, or Hispanic American/Latino heritage
- Giving birth to at least one baby weighing more than 9 pounds
- Having high blood pressure measuring 140/90 or higher
- Having abnormal cholesterol or triglyceride levels
- Being physically inactive - exercising fewer than three times a week

People with blood glucose levels that are higher than normal but not yet in the diabetic range have "prediabetes". Doctors sometimes call this condition impaired fasting glucose (IFG) or impaired glucose tolerance (EGT), depending on the test used to diagnose it. Insulin resistance and prediabetes usually have no symptoms. You may have one or both conditions for several years without noticing anything.

If you have prediabetes, you have a higher risk of developing type 2 diabetes. In addition, people with prediabetes also have a higher risk of heart disease.

Progression to diabetes among those with prediabetes is not inevitable. Weight loss and increased physical activity can prevent or delay diabetes and may return blood glucose levels to normal.

National Prevention Week - May 18-14, 2014



National Prevention Week is an observance sponsored by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration-supported annual health observance dedicated to increasing public awareness of, and action around, substance abuse and mental health issues. National Prevention Week 2014 is about **Our Lives. Our Health. Our Future.** Each of us has an important role in maintaining a healthy life and ensuring a productive future.

This observance is an opportunity to join with other individuals, organizations, and coalitions in your community to promote prevention efforts, educate others about behavioral health issues, and create and strengthen community partnerships.

National Prevention Week is held each year near the start of summer. Summer is a season filled with celebrations and recreational activities where substance use and abuse can happen, such as graduation parties, proms, weddings, sporting events, and outdoor activities. **National Prevention Week** is timed to allow schools to take part in a prevention-themed event before the school year ends, raising awareness in students of all ages. The percentages of marijuana, cigarette and alcohol initiates among youth increase between spring (April and May) and summer (June and July), and the timing of **National Prevention Week** helps to educate young people and their families at this crucial time of year.

National Prevention Week supports the concept that effective prevention of mental and substance use disorders requires consistent action. It underscores the efforts suggested by the National Prevention Strategy to raise awareness about substance abuse and mental health, and garnering public support through local events and nationwide participation. The National Prevention Strategy emphasizes that prevention should be woven into all aspects of our lives - including where and how we live, learn, work, and play - and that everyone has a role in creating a healthier nation.

There are many ways to make a difference. One is to join the efforts of the Millstone Township Municipal Alliance to Prevent Substance Abuse and learn how you can get involved. Join us for our next meeting on Thursday, May 8th at 7:00 PM in the Municipal Court Building. We will be discussing some current drug trends and what we are seeing in our community. 
