

**Planning Board 4-9-14 Meeting**

**Approval of Meeting Minutes: 3-12-14**

**Resolution:**

**P14-01 Frogbridge, Inc.** - Block 53, Lot 2 - Located at 7 Yellow Meeting House Road consisting of 85.57 acres in the RC (Recreation Camp) Zone. Applicant received Preliminary and Final Major Site Plan Approval to build a Day Camp in Resolutions Memorialized 9-9-98 and 2-10-99. **A Message from the Tax Assessor's Office**

As part of the new Monmouth County Assessment Program, Millstone Township is required to inspect the exterior and interior of 20% of the properties each year (over a five year span the whole Township will be inspected). The field inspector will have a Township Photo ID and attire from Millstone Township.

Also, the program requires that 100% of the properties in the Township be reassessed annually. Assessment Postcard notices will be mailed out on or about November 15th.

**\*\* REMINDER TO ALL RESIDENTS \*\***

**Township Code Book Chapter 3,  
Police Regulations, Section 3-26**

**Manufacturing, Selling,  
Transporting or Using Fireworks**

"Any person who shall manufacture, sell, transport or use fireworks, or permit the use of fireworks on premises under ones ownership or control, shall be adjudged in violation of this chapter. "Fireworks," as used herein, shall include any combustible or explosive composition, or any substance or combination of substances, or article prepared for the purpose of producing a visible or an audible effect by combustion, explosion, deflagration or detonation. Persons having ownership or control of premises at which fireworks have been used in violation of this subsection shall give rise to a rebuttable presumption to having permitted the use of fireworks on such premises. Such presumption may be rebutted by submitting evidence that such person took affirmative action to stop or prevent such use, or was not physically at or in close proximity to the premises at any time during such use. It shall be a defense to a charge hereunder if the person shall have been issued a permit by written resolution of the Township Committee pursuant to the provisions of the State Fire Prevention Code."

Any person who shall violate any provisions of this Code shall upon conviction thereof, be punishable by one or more of the following: a fine not exceeding \$2,000.00 or imprisonment for a period not exceeding 90 days or community service not exceeding 90 days or a combination of the above.

The deadline for residents to file their 2013 Senior Freeze (Property Tax Reimbursement) applications has been extended to September 15, 2014.







## Heroin Comes to Suburban Towns – including ours

If people aren't aware that heroin use is on the rise, particularly in some of New Jersey's suburban communities, then they are just not listening. Heroin has become a major problem in the state and is affecting all communities. It is easy to say that it only happens in urban, high crime communities, or "not in my back yard". But the fact is heroin has become a major problem affecting all communities—even our own. County officials explain that it's affluent, suburban areas that are the customers for these drug-dealing areas. Our youth have the money and the means to access heroin and the sources are all around us. In a recent poll of the top 20 locations in New Jersey for the highest number of heroin abuse cases, Trenton came in at #10 and Jackson came in at #12.



At a recent forum held in a north Jersey suburb, one of the panelists was a young woman from the community - a former DARE student, former high school cheerleader, - who was introduced to heroin by her boyfriend, also from the same community. She shocked the audience with her description of her descent into heroin addiction. Her message was heard loud and clear. Heroin use and addiction can and does happen in "good" communities. It is a problem that affects all of us. It doesn't discriminate on race, ethnicity, affluence, geographic location, gender or ethnicity.

One prevention step that parents can take is to be very cautious with any medicines they or their children may have been prescribed. In many cases, the first experience many youth have is with drugs they take from their own medicine cabinet. And, kids usually don't first start with heroin or misuse of prescription drugs. Talk with many young people in rehab and they report that their problems started with alcohol and marijuana. Parents need to be especially vigilant during summer-time where youth have more freedom and less supervision.

We are disrespecting each other and ourselves by illegally dumping, defacing property and the use of vehicles on public areas where they do not belong. As you leaving a park or trail, please remember to pick up your trash, dispose of it properly and everyone can enjoy a clean space!.



## PREVENTING TICK BITES



While it is a good idea to take preventive measures against ticks year-round, be extra vigilant in warmer months (April-September) when ticks are most active.

- Avoid wooded and bushy areas with high grass and leaf litter.
- Walk in the center of trails.
- Use repellents that contain 20 to 30% DEET (N,N-diethyl-m-toluamide) on exposed skin and clothing for protection that lasts up to several hours. Always follow product instructions. Parents should apply this product to their children, avoiding hands, eyes, and mouth.
- Use products that contain permethrin on clothing. Treat clothing and gear, such as boots, pants, socks and tents with products containing 0.5% permethrin. It remains protective through several washings. Pre-treated clothing is available and may be protective longer.
- Other repellents registered by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) may be found at <http://cfpub.epa.gov/oppref/insect/>.
- Bathe or shower as soon as possible after coming indoors (preferably within two hours) to wash off and more easily find ticks that are crawling on you.
- Conduct a full-body tick check using a hand-held or full-length mirror to view all parts of your body upon return from tick-infested areas. Parents should check their children for ticks under the arms, in and around the ears, inside the belly button, behind the knees, between the legs, around the waist, and especially in their hair.
- Examine gear and pets. Ticks can ride into the home on clothing and pets, then attach to a person later, so carefully examine pets, coats, and day packs.
- Tumble clothes in a dryer on high heat for an hour to kill remaining ticks. (Some research suggests that shorter drying times may also be effective, particularly if the clothing is not wet).
- If you find a tick attached to your skin, there is no need to panic. There are several tick removal devices on the market, but a plain set of fine-tipped tweezers will remove a tick quite effectively.

## HOW TO REMOVE A TICK

1. Use fine-tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to the skin's surface as possible.
2. Pull upward with steady, even pressure. Do not twist or jerk the tick; this can cause the mouth-parts to break off and remain in the skin. If this happens, remove the mouth-parts with tweezers. If you are unable to remove the mouth easily with clean tweezers, leave it alone and let the skin heal.
3. After removing the tick, thoroughly clean the bite area and your hands with rubbing alcohol, and iodine scrub, or soap and water.

Avoid folklore remedies such as "painting" the tick with nail polish or petroleum jelly, or using heat to make the tick detach from the skin. Your goal is to remove the tick as quickly as possible; not waiting for it to detach.

If you develop a rash or fever within several weeks of removing a tick, see your doctor. Be sure to tell the doctor about your recent tick bite, when the bite occurred, and where you most likely acquired the tick.
