

Approval of Meeting Minutes: May 13, 2015

Ordinance 15-12

An Ordinance Amending Chapter XXXV (Land Use), Article VI (Conditional Uses) Section 6-3 (Wireless Communication Facilities) of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Millstone, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey.

This Amendment brings the Township's Telecommunication's Ordinance into compliance with the recent FCC rule changes.







An Article from the Millstone Alliance to Prevent Substance Abuse

BUT MOST DON'T START WITH HEROIN . . .

Much has been made of the deadly drug's crawl into suburbia and it is a fact that New Jersey's heroin crisis is likely closer to home than many of us like to think. Heroin and other opioids were the primary drugs of nearly 50 percent of all substance abuse treatment patients in 2014, up nearly 10 percentage points in the last decade. There were at least 781 heroin-related deaths in New Jersey in 2014, the fifth straight year the figure has seen a precipitous rise. It is easy to assume that the state's larger urban areas like Trenton, Camden, Jersey City and Atlantic City will always have high numbers, but when you calculate the per capita rate of heroin treatment admissions in each town, you find out that a place as close to us as Farmingdale is ranked number 13 in heroin treatment admissions in the entire state.

However, the fact remains, that most young people do not start with heroin. In talking with young people in drug treatment programs most will tell you they started with alcohol or marijuana. In fact alcohol is still the drug of choice amount young people, followed by marijuana and then prescription drugs - which as we now know, can lead a path to an addiction to heroin. And while there are many uplifting stories of persons who attain sobriety and experience successful recovery from alcohol and drug related problems, an important fact remains - prevention works.

Parents need to start having the conversation about drugs with their children early and often, be informed about what to look for in terms of signs and symptoms and know where to go for help. A young person's curiosity and alcohol and other drugs can be a dangerous combination. Check out these websites for important information:

Solutions to Stormwater Pollution

Easy Things You Can Do Every Day To Protect Our Water

A Guide to Healthy Habits for Cleaner Water

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings: You name it and it ends up in our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we're all doing something about it.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it's dirty.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.



As a resident, business, or other member of the New Jersey community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water.



Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides

- Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer.
- Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted.
- Look into alternatives for pesticides.
- Maintain a small lawn and keep the rest of your property or yard in a natural state with trees and other native vegetation that requires little or no fertilizer.
- If you use fertilizers and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply it.

Make sure you properly store or discard any unused portions.

Properly use and dispose of hazardous products

- Hazardous products include some household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze, and paints.
- Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain because storm drains are usually connected to local waterbodies and the water is not treated.

- If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance.
- Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible.
- Recycle used motor oil.
- Contact your municipality, county or facility management office for the locations of hazardous-waste disposal facilities.



Keep pollution out of storm drains

- Municipalities and many other public agencies are required to mark certain storm drain inlets with messages reminding people that storm drains are connected to local waterbodies.
- Do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a stormwater system.

Clean up after your pet

- Many municipalities and public agencies must enact and enforce local pet-waste rules.
- An example is requiring pet owners or their keepers to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.
- Make sure you know your town's or agency's requirements and comply with them. It's the law. And remember to:
 - Use newspaper, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes.
 - Dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet.
 - Never discard pet waste in a storm drain.



Don't litter

- Place litter in trash receptacles.
- Recycle. Recycle. Recycle.
- Participate in community cleanups.

Dispose of yard waste properly

- Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.
- If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them.
- Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost.
- Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.
