





Millstone Shade Tree Commission (MSTC) "Branching Out in the Community"

MSTC Secures \$10,000 CISP Grant

On August 14, 2017 the MSTC was awarded a \$10,000 Grant from the NJ Department of Environmental Protection Agency, Division of Parks & Forestry Service. "Our committee members have worked diligently in creating the administrative infrastructure that now allows Millstone Township to actively compete for various grants that will assist with the goals of our Community Forestry Management Plan. We are excited by this award," explained MSTC Chairman, Ron Schlegel.


The MSTC finalized the Township's Community Forestry Management Plan in 2016 and as a result were able to compete for this grant offered by the Community Stewardship Incentive Program (CISP). "The MSTC will apply these funds toward our "Street Tree Inventory Program" which is part of our five year plan," described committee member Chris Porcello. As illustrated in the groups' plan, a Street Tree Inventory enables a township and their public works field staff to have an inventory of trees planted within the public right of way and to be able to actively prepare for related maintenance and management workflows.

The MSTC Street Tree Inventory began several years ago with a section of the Township already catalogued, however the effort was largely dormant due to costs and a committee transition. With this grant, the group looks forward to tackling new sections of this inventory process over the next several years.

MSTC Hosts Seminar on Destructive Emerald Ash Borer Beetle

The beetles are coming and this is not an invasion of the musical kind! The United States is under siege by a horticulture pest from East Asia known as the Emerald Ash Borer Beetle. Due to these pests hitching a ride on international container ships and aircraft these beetles, with a taste for ash trees, are destroying American forests and neighborhoods. The destruction started in the Great Lakes Region through beetles transported through the shipping channels. In particular, the City of Cincinnati was very adversely affected in many of their neighborhoods which were largely dominated by a street tree inventory of ash trees.

On May 23, 2017 the MSTC hosted an event at the Township offices with a technical presentation by Richard Buckley, from the Plant Diagnostics Laboratory at Rutgers University. During the discussion, attendees were able to identify the pests, the conditions and what ash trees look like. Unfortunately once the destructive conditions are observed on a tree it's generally too late to save. However, now that the Street Tree Inventory plan will be underway, there is optimism that there are mitigation procedures to save trees before they are destroyed.



Solutions to Stormwater Pollution

Easy Things You Can Do Every Day To Protect Our Water

A Guide to Healthy Habits for Cleaner Water

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings: You name it and it ends up in our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we're all doing something about it.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it's dirty.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.



As a resident, business, or other member of the New Jersey community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water.

Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides

- Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer.
- Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted.
- Look into alternatives for pesticides.
- Maintain a small lawn and keep the rest of your property or yard in a natural state with trees and other native vegetation that requires little or no fertilizer.
- If you use fertilizers and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply it.



Make sure you properly store or discard any unused portions.

Properly use and dispose of hazardous products

- Hazardous products include some household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze, and paints.
- Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain because storm drains are usually connected to local waterbodies and the water is not treated.

■ If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance.

■ Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible.

■ Recycle used motor oil.

■ Contact your municipality, county or facility management office for the locations of hazardous-waste disposal facilities.



Clean up after your pet

■ Many municipalities and public agencies must enact and enforce local pet-waste rules.

■ An example is requiring pet owners or their keepers to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.

■ Make sure you know your town's or agency's requirements and comply with them. It's the law. And remember to:

■ Use newspaper, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes.

■ Dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet.

■ Never discard pet waste in a storm drain.



Dispose of yard waste properly

■ Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.

■ If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them.

■ Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost.

■ Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.



Don't litter

■ Place litter in trash receptacles.

■ Recycle. Recycle. Recycle.

■ Participate in community cleanups.

Keep pollution out of storm drains

■ Municipalities and many other public agencies are required to mark certain storm drain inlets with messages reminding people that storm drains are connected to local waterbodies.

■ Do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a stormwater system.

Don't feed wildlife

■ Do not feed wildlife, such as ducks and geese, in public areas.

■ Many municipalities and other public agencies must enact and enforce a rule that prohibits wildlife feeding in these areas.
