Ordinance No. 16-04**

An Ordinance Amending Chapter XXXV (Land Use) Article IX Design and Performance Standards and Construction Specifications, Section 11-33 (Threatened and Endangered Species) of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Millstone, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey. A Message from Shade Tree Commission on Tree Planting Tips

Here are a few simple tips to remember when planting your tree this spring:

Preparing the perfect hole for planting

Dig the hole two to three times the width of the root ball. Do NOT dig deeper than root ball depth. Make the sides of the hole slant gradually outward.

- * For bareroot trees, neatly cut away any broken or damaged roots. Soak the roots for a few hours prior to planting to allow them to absorb water.
- * Container-grown trees should have the plastic or metal containers completely removed. Carefully cut through any circling roots. Remove the top half of pressed peat/paper containers.
- * Balled and Burlapped (B&B) trees should have all ropes cut and removed. Cut and remove the burlap from at least the top third of the rootball. Slit remaining burlap to encourage root growth. Cut away the wire basket and remove it.

Planting the Tree


Gently place the tree in the hole. Ensure the top of the rootball is at or slightly above ground level. Partially backfill using a mixture of soil from the hole, topsoil and peat moss. Water to settle the soil then finish back-filling the hole. Tamp the soil gently, but do not step on the root ball.

A few additional pointers:

- Remove tags and labels.
- Do not stake unless the tree has a large crown or was planted on a windy site. Stake for a maximum of one year.
- Prune only the damaged branches.
- Soak the soil well, making sure no air pockets form between roots. Wait until next year to fertilize.
- Spread two inches of mulch over the root zone, but do not place in contact with the trunk.
- Be sure the root ball has adequate water throughout the year. The best technique for watering a tree is to leave a very slow dripping hose at the base of the trunk for approximately ½ hour to ensure the water doesn't stay at the surface. This will encourage the roots to grow deeper into the soil.

Checking up on your new Tree

It's always best to check up on freshly planted trees to make sure they are adjusting to their new environment. Make sure they are receiving enough water and sunlight. Check for pests and distress.





Millstone Township Veterans Memorial Council is proud to invite you to attend the Millstone Memorial Day Parade and Honors Ceremony on Monday May 30th. The Allentown High School Marching Band will begin the parade promptly at 9:30 AM, rain or shine. The parade route begins at the Clarksburg Post Office on Route 524 Stagecoach Road and ends at the Veterans Memorial next to the Municipal Building. Ample parking is available along the parade route at Bowman's Court, or near where the parade will end near the Community Center and the Clarksburg Inn. The public is urged to arrive early by 8:30 AM to park, as all roads leading to the Stagecoach Road parade route will be closed at 9:15AM. Immediately following the parade an Honors Ceremony will be held at the Veterans Memorial. There will be a special ceremony to honor US Troops who were killed in action or who died as a result of their Military Service. A representative of the New Jersey National Guard will give the keynote address. Angela Bernieri, Natalie Ligotino and Sara Zerilli will lead the singing of the National Anthem, verses of "Taps" and God Bless America. Following the ceremony the Clarksburg Inn will host a free barbeque to the attending public. (Cash bar is available for sodas and drinks.) A Message from the Millstone Drug Alliance Parents Can Help Reinforce Important Prevention Messages

Teens receive lots of messages encouraging early use of alcohol and other drugs from a variety of different sources - their peers, movies, television shows or even the music they listen to. Prevention efforts, are designed to counteract those negative influences by providing children and teens with the facts about the dangers and consequences of early use of alcohol and other drugs. Prevention programs that the Millstone Alliance provides in the Millstone schools include the Life Skills Training program for 5th graders and the BABES program for 3rd graders.

If you ask your child he or she will tell you that they get more than enough drug prevention information: they hear it from their parents; at school they have special programs, posters, pamphlets, films, lectures and discussions; they hear public service advertisements on radio and television; and special observances like Red Ribbon Week in October and Alcohol Awareness Month in April.

But in spite of all our best efforts that target this age group with prevention information, national surveys tell us that many of them are still not really getting the message or that it is not reinforced by their family or in the community. And that makes sense. If we are teaching elementary students that they should not drink until the legal age of 21, but they just attended a family party where all of their teenage cousins were served alcohol to "celebrate", they are definitely getting a mixed message.

Research shows that parents have the strongest influence over their child's decision to drink or experiment with drugs, yet in a recent National Survey on Drug Use and Health, 40% of teens said they did not ever have a conversation with their parents about the dangers of alcohol and other drug use. Specifically the NSDUH survey looked at exposure to prevention messages for two adolescent age groups: those 12 to 14 and teens 15 to 17. The survey found that the younger group was more likely to have received prevention messages in school, but less likely than the older group to have received them from media or their parents.

Parents should be aware that it is never too early to begin a family conversation about the dangers and consequences of alcohol and drug abuse. In fact the American Academy of Pediatrics reports that children as young as 8 years old have already made some decisions about drinking, and that parents just don't feel comfortable or feel they have the skills to start these important decisions.

As part of our Alliance's "Talk, They Hear You" initiative, we are offering a free, four session program - "Got Skills?". This program, targeting elementary age children, is open to all residents of Millstone Township. It's important to have the conversation - and we will help you get started. Property Tax Reimbursement (Senior Freeze)

2015

Eligibility Requirements*

You must meet ALL of the following requirements:

- You were age 65 or older as of December 31, 2014, or, if under age 65, you were actually receiving Federal Social Security disability benefit payments on or before December 31, 2014, and December 31, 2015; *and*
 - You have lived in New Jersey continuously since December 31, 2004, or earlier, as either a homeowner or a renter; *and*
 - You have owned and lived in your home (or have leased a site in a mobile home park for a manufactured or mobile home that you own) since December 31, 2011, or earlier; *and*
 - You paid the full amount of the 2014 property taxes due on your home by June 1, 2015, and paid the 2015 property taxes by June 1, 2016; *and*
 - Your total annual income for 2014 did not exceed \$85,553* and for 2015 did not exceed \$87,007.* **NOTE:** With very few exceptions, all income received during the year must be taken into account to determine eligibility (including social security, pension income, etc.)
- * Eligibility requirements, including income limits, and benefits available under this program may be changed by the State Budget. Any changes to the 2015 eligibility requirements will not be finalized until the completion of the State Budget that must be adopted by July 1, 2016.

Monmouth County monitoring Zika virus situation

Health Department and Mosquito Control Division coordinating efforts

The Monmouth County Mosquito Control Division and Health Department (MCHD) are actively monitoring the Zika virus (Zika) situation and urges residents to be cautious when traveling to countries where Zika transmission is happening.

Zika virus is spread to people through mosquito bites.

“Currently, there is no evidence of Zika in Monmouth County,” said Freeholder Deputy Director Serena DiMasio. “The County is closely monitoring the situation and is prepared to take action when, and if, necessary.”

The Center for Disease Control and Prevention has issued [travel information](#) for those planning to travel to countries that have reported local transmission of the Zika, including Central America, South America, the Caribbean and Mexico.

“If you are traveling out of the country, make sure to check if there is a threat of Zika in the country you are traveling to and, if so, take the proper precautions to prevent mosquito bites,” said DiMasio.

The most common symptoms of Zika are fever, rash, joint pain, and conjunctivitis (red eyes). The illness is usually mild with symptoms lasting from several days to a week. Severe disease requiring hospitalization is uncommon.

“The Health Department is in constant communication with the CDC and NJ Department of Health regarding the evolving Zika situation,” said Christopher Merkel, Monmouth County Public Health Coordinator. “Residents should actively connect to accurate, well-known and legitimate information sources and dismiss misinformation from non-credible sources.”

“We are learning more about Zika every day” DiMasio said. “Links to the most current information, including travel notices, are available on the Monmouth County website at www.visitmonmouth.com.”
