Statement by newly appointed Mayor:

M/Grbelja first I'd like to thank everyone here on the township committee and it's been said before this is a very diverse group and the expertise each one of us brings to the township and think over the past several years you've been able to see a group of people who have been able to handle the finances, I have absolutely no financial experience what so ever, and I rely on everybody at the end of this table to move us in the right direction. I think everybody brings something different we do complement

each other, we argue, we agree but I think everybody within this municipality whether your one of our professionals, employees, volunteers or you sit up here on the dais we all want the same thing for Millstone Township, and that is a community that has the quality of life that we enjoy, the rural character and that old hometown feeling, of knowing who your neighbors are. It really is a great community it's like coming home to paradise. I'm extremely happy with our professionals they understand exactly what we want. Duane your firm has done a great job, for the community your legal expertise is outstanding, you give us very good advice to keep us in the straight and narrow and has allowed us to in many cases fight the battles we need to fight. I can't say enough about our Engineering firm, we had a project in place prior to Matt coming on board that was going to cost the township \$1,200,000 they came in and did the project for \$400,000 and I have to tell you his firm has been outstanding and dedicated to Millstone. They understand what we want, they work well with our Environmental Commission, our Planning Board, our Board of Adjustment and I have to say I'm so thrilled that we have you locked up in Millstone. The job your people have done has been great we always have an Engineering presence in Millstone on so many different issues. I can't say enough about our Planner as well. Every single professional Millstone really has employed has gone above and beyond and provided with the type of expertise that we need to protect our community and to move forward in the new millennium and the challenges we are facing. I can't forget our employees, over the past year what we did because of the finances and the interest rates and the climate of the State and Nation, interest rates being done and our ability to generate revenue to support tax and expenses needed within the township have diminished so we've had to make some changes where we've had to cut some positions, reduce some positions to part time and in some cases have had people retire so we've consolidated some positions, they have stepped up, they're very conscientious, they do a great job and this township would not be able to run without the dedication of all our employees from the municipal building all the way down to DPW, sometimes I can a little critical of our DPW even with the snow storm that we had it was very difficult and they were out there working very hard all night long trying to clean up the streets. I'm very happy with the moves we are making and the direction we are moving in. The volunteers that we have from the Boards and Commissions, they have been invaluable they really have a sense from the Planning Board, Environmental Commission, Board of Adjustment, Shade Tree Commission, Agricultural Council, Historic Commission everybody working together all moving for the same goal to protect the quality of life that we have in Millstone Township and to keep it as affordable as possible. That's going to be the challenge before this Township Committee for the next year. We will need to brainstorm to provide the services to our residents and in addition to that keep our taxes as low as possible that's going to be monumental in trying to put this year's budget together. For those of you who have not met Phil, Phil is the new Township Administrator/DPW head. For the first month he's probably seen it all, we welcome you on board and part of the Millstone Township family. People say look at my taxes, I would like people to look at their tax bills and look at what your municipal taxes are they are probably only about 5% of your tax bill comes to the municipality for municipal operating expenses. Even though you may think your tax bill is high please do not think for one moment that that money is utilized by the township. Our biggest bang for our money happens to be our Open Space and our Farmland Preservation this community time after time has made a decision that residents were interested in buying open space and preserving farmland and quite often we have had criticism, people take a look in the paper and seen that we bought a million dollars worth of farmland and they say why are we spending money on farmland why aren't we putting it in the school. The money is dedicated only for the use of land acquisition, historical purchases and also recreation and the maintenance of those items. It cannot be used for anything else, it cannot be used for operate schools it can't be used to operate the municipality

it can only be used for that. To tell you the truth with property values down now is the best time to be purchasing it's the most opportune time to purchase land. For every piece of land we purchase it's like putting money in the bank, we don't have to build schools, we don't have to build roads it really is a cost saving measure and is probably one of the most important things that we have to keep our taxes in check. So I don't want to see people getting alarmed when they see the purchases being made because it really is very smart purchase. I will also say of that million dollars if you see in the paper the commitment of the township is only \$160,000. 84% percent is picked up by other agencies, so if you have any questions please give any member of the township committee a call, we'd be more than happy to explain, we don't want the residents to be misinformed. This year with each month we will be able to have one of our volunteer boards and commissions do a presentation before the township committee so you really have an idea of what's going on. So with that it's another new year thank you very much for giving me the opportunity to serve as Mayor I appreciate it and I'm sure this year we will continue to move forward and represent the residents of Millstone Township very well.
