MAYOR KINSEY CALLS THE REGULAR MEETING TO ORDER AT 8:20 PM FOLLOWED BY A FLAG SALUTE AND A MOMENT OF SILENCE.

PRESENTATION:

M/Kinsey introduces Millstone Township’s Drug Alliance Coordinator Helen Varvi and New Jersey State Police Detective Gramiccioni:

Helen Varvi, Coordinator of the Millstone Township Drug Alliance thanks Mayor Kinsey for this opportunity and states that she has been doing this in the community since 1992.

Below are some points made by both Helen Varvi and Det. Gramiccioni:

Helen Varvi

- New Vision for Millstone Township - The mission is to be a catalyst for community change by engaging all sectors of the community to work together to raise awareness, improve communication, provide education, establish positive

community norms and provide support for youth and adults to make healthy lifestyle choices.

- Focus on underage drinking – Children are starting to drink at an earlier age; children who start drinking under 15 years of age are 4 times more likely to become alcohol dependent as they age and early start equals increase in risky behavior and other drug use.
- Community Impact – Parents who host lose the most, more website information, raise awareness of Host Liability, support enforcement of our Private Property Ordinance, Support youth, especially those in recovery and Double Alliance Membership.

Helen then states that the Alliance provides school and community programs such as. Count on Me Kids, BABES, Peer Leaders (MS & HS), Achiever's Club, Parent Programs, Community Survey and Community Events: (Chess Fest, Fishing Derby). Helen gives the 2012 National Trends Survey numbers on smoking, inhalant abuse, alcohol use, marijuana use and ecstasy. Then Helen gives a substance abuse overview in Millstone Township from 2009 – 2012. The Alliance hears about underage drinking, unsupervised parties and supervised parties (where parents take the keys). We need to promote the children that are doing the right thing and not the ones that are doing wrong.

Detective Gramiccioni states that Helen hit on everyone of his topics. He speaks about what is going on in Millstone Township, it has been very quiet in Millstone, he has done 2 tours on the roads here and he is from Hunterdon County which is a similar area. Det. Gramiccioni speaks how Heroin is the drug of choice these days. It is cheap but also a nasty drug. He spoke about a 19 year old girl from the area that he recently arrested and how her boyfriend turned her onto the drug and how he took her to Trenton and she leaned the streets to buy the drug. The background of these kids using Heroin has no bearing, they are straight A students and come from all works of life, and once they are hooked they are hooked, there is no easy way to overcome Heroin use.
