Cover : Robins Tavern

This image was sketched by Henrickson and created in pastel by G.T. Blanche circa 1850 is the earliest rendition of the well documented Robins Tavern circa 1740s. It's a small snapshot of it's original 117 acres. Over the horizon was South River Road now named Agress Road. The building itself was a large two story structure on a sandstone foundation. The Tavern is flanked by two Willow Trees, giving its title many years later as the "Olde Willow Tree Tavern". It once stood on the East corner of Stagecoach and Rising Sun Tavern Roads. In June 1778, both sides of the Revolutionary War camped here days apart as they headed towards Freehold, engaging in a conflict we know today as the Battle of Monmouth.






Thomas Gravatt left his signature in the wall of the vestibule of the Clarksburg Methodist Church now the Cultural Center located at 512 Stagecoach Road. It was found during renovation in 2017. Thomas was the head carpenter in 1844 who constructed the Church. He was also a Postmaster in Clarksburg, a Committeeman and Chosen Freeholder. On November 20, 1871 Thomas died of lockjaw caused by a very small splinter. Unfortunately the Tetanus Vaccine wasn't developed until the early 1900s.

Fun Facts: A Journeyman or day worker in 1844 received a whopping 62 1/2 cents for their days labor.

You're looking at the original First Aid building in Perrineville. It was located at 215 Millstone Road. A group of six poultry farmers decided the community needed emergency services and formed a squad. Buying a 1941 ambulance for \$450 dollars, they parked it in a chicken coop on Abe Seidel's farm in Perrineville. On June 28, 1954, the group incorporated and plans were quickly made for a building. A \$200 donation from the Township, and a \$1,500 bank loan, plus many volunteer hours made this building possible. A new building was dedicated in 1983 at 899 Perrineville Road. The original building was sold to the Township for municipal business. It now serves as the Municipal Court House. Today all of our emergency services are provided by the Millstone Township Fire Company.

Fun facts: Before we had a "court house" hearings were held in Judge Brody's home on Clarksburg Road. If things didn't go well, the jail cell was in his back yard, yes it's still standing! Years later, court was held in the Clarksburg School which is our municipal building today located at 470 Stagecoach Road.

We know we can please you in assortment and grade and hope to have your order for such as you may need, while the stock is unbroken. We plant only Pure, Natural Southern Seed, (gathered expressly for us by our agent South,) on ground not before used, either for Orchard or Nursery, and use every precaution, from planting to packing, to have our trees strictly healthy and true to name. The trees ripen about October 20th to November 1st. We can refer to many of the largest growers in the Country, and invite buyers to make personal inspection.

Philip and Sophie Restine (P.J.R. Farm) owned over 100 acres on Stagecoach Road by the 1940s. This photo shows the area around 240 Stagecoach Road. It also shows hand-picking spinach and packing it for market. This produce was transported to Freehold to meet the train. Many farms grew products like spinach and tomatoes for the big companies such as Birds Eye and Campbell's. The truck sports the rural route address used for mailing.

Fun Fact: By this time the tractor replaced the horse. By the late 1940s, horse drawn equipment stopped being manufactured.

The Clarksburg Post Office has occupied multiple locations throughout its service. The first one was in a store owned by David Bowman, he being the first Postmaster in 1837. It was located on the west side of the Clarksburg Methodist Church, now our Cultural Center at 512 Stagecoach Rd. The second was in a store on Stagecoach Road in the middle of Clarksburg, featured in July of last year's calendar. That location held the office from 1844 until 1966 when the Postmistress Mrs. Elsie Kreutner, retired. The third was on the property of Charles and Lillian Noreika's business at 370 Millstone Rd. The Noreika's opened that location in 1967, Lillian being the Postmistress. The surrounding area outgrew the quaint Post Office and a larger one was built across the road at 424 Stagecoach Rd, opening June 11, 1984.





The Manalapan Presbyterian Church was once located on the corners of Route 33 and Conover Road. When built in 1855 the property was considered Manalapan but the borders changed between municipalities and it was incorporated into Millstone years later. The once thriving church also had a parsonage and cemetery. In 1954, the congregation merged with the Perrineville Church to create the “United Presbyterian Church of Millstone”. Shortly after that the Manalapan church was torn down. The only thing left are the monuments in the cemetery on Conover Road, reminding us of the people that came before us to make Millstone so special.



HISTORY OF THE PLEDGE

On September 8, 1892 the Boston based “The Youth Companion” magazine published a few words for students to repeat on Columbus Day that year. Thousands of leaflets were distributed to the public schools all over the country. On October 12, the 400th anniversary of Columbus' arrival more than 2 million children recited the Pledge of Allegiance written by Francis Bellamy, and thus began a school ritual. “I Pledge Allegiance to my flag and the Republic for which it stands one nation indivisible with liberty and justice for all”. On June 14, 1923 at the first National Flag conference in Washington D.C. a change was made for clarity; “the flag of the United States”. Congress officially recognized the words in 1943. President Dwight D. Eisenhower amended the pledge in June 1954 adding the words “under God” to reaffirm the transcendence of religious faith in America's heritage and future; in this way we shall constantly strengthen those spiritual weapons which forever will be our country's most powerful resource in peace and war.

As a schoolboy, one of my teachers explained the words and meaning for the Pledge of Allegiance. Later I wrote it down and eventually recorded it. The following is my observation.

I - ME; an individual; a committee of one.

PLEDGE - dedicate all of my worlds goods to give without self-pity.

TO THE FLAG- Our standard; Old Glory; a symbol of Freedom; wherever she waves there is respect, because your loyalty has given her a dignity that shouts, Freedom is everybody's job.

UNITED- That means that we have all come together.

STATES- Individual communities that have united into forty-eight great states. Forty-eight individual communities with pride and dignity and purpose. All divided with imaginary boundaries, yet united to a common purpose, and that is Love for Country.

AND TO THE REPUBLIC- Republic- a state in which sovereign power is invested in representatives chosen by the people to govern. And government is the people; and it's from the people to the leaders, not from the leaders to the people.

FOR WHICH IT STANDS

ONE NATION- One Nation-meaning, so blessed by God.

INDIVISIBLE- Incapable of being divided.

WITH LIBERTY- which is Freedom; the right of power to live one's life, without threats, fear or some sort of retaliation.

AND JUSTICE- the principle, or qualities, of dealing fairly with others.

FOR ALL- which means, boys and girls, it's as much your country as it is mine.

Since I was a small boy two states have been added to our country and two words have been added to the Pledge of Allegiance: UNDER GOD.

Wouldn't it be a pity if someone said that is a prayer and that would be eliminated from schools too?
