COMMENTS FROM THE DAIS:

C/Masci discusses the challenges we are facing at the recycling yard. Residents should only be dropping off what is acceptable. M/Dorfman thanks the residents for their participation in recycling. Recently both the County and State have been auditing materials that are dropped off in recycling bins and unfortunately for Millstone there have been times when residents have dropped off unacceptable items.

M/Dorfman states that with the State Budget cuts to Boards of Education our school has received a reduction of \$255,000 for them original amount appropriated. Our Legislators, State Senator Thompson, Assemblyman Clifton & Assemblyman Dancer have scheduled a meeting with the State Department of Education Commissioner along with the Mayors and School Board Administrators within their districts.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Mayor Dorfman opens the meeting to the public at 8:26 p.m.

1. Richard Tomer - Stage Coach Road - States it's not unusual that the power goes out however on July 22, 2018 it went out at 1:00am for 7 - 8 hours. There was only a minor storm and his main concern is his refrigerator and water. Power was not restored until 12:30 p.m. and was told that there was a reported 650 homes without power. Does anyone know why the power was out for so long. Administrator Maria Dellasala will contact JCP&L to see why the power was out. M/Dorfman states that we work with JCP&L and they are committed to us. Just about 3 weeks ago JCP&L did a fly over of the township checking transmission lines. Look at the JCP&L outages map on their website for outages and restoration. C/Masci states we have some challenging areas and we have regular meeting scheduled with JCP&L. They do tree cutting back as does the township however we cannot go on private property. JCP&L recently did all new transmission lines along route 33. C/Grbelja states it depends what grid you are on. There is a grid map in the Administrator's office. C/Kuczinski states in Millstone there are very big mature trees and a lot of accidents. C/Masci states one problem is the people who are driving on their cell phones and causing accidents taking down poles.
