The Agricultural Advisory Board is pursing two farmland preservation applications and will be sending comments to the State Agriculture Development Committee opposing a rule change about deed of easements.

The use of the Township address was without Township approval and/or knowledge. Additionally, the New Jersey State Police have been notified and the investigation is ongoing with the Federal, State and County Agencies.
