Mayor Ferro read a Proclamation Designating November 25, 2023 as Eagle Scout Day in Millstone Township for the following individuals: Ethan Francis Bailey, Rafferty Logan Burden, Jai Jatin Patel, Damian Michael Soumbeniotis and Anastasios Thomas Soumbeniotis. Each Eagle Scout stated their project that allowed them to achieve this great honor. M/Ferro stated that he attended the Eagle Scout Court of Honor on November 25th and distributed their plaques at the ceremony. The Township Committee congratulated them on achieving Eagle Scout.

PRESENTATION:

Captain Maloney, Millstone Township Fire District, discussed the EMS program and some of the challenges the program faces at the end of this year. The program inherited a 2012 ambulance which has significant maintenance/repair issues and has been down a lot due to the repairs, which leaves the Township down to one ambulance to serve the Township. Due to prudent financial management and the ability to transport patients from other communities, the Fire District is able to purchase in 2024 an additional ambulance with no impact to the taxpayers. Unfortunately, the cost of a new ambulance has doubled in price over the past few years to approximately \$317,000. The Fire District has located a remounted ambulance on a 2024 chassis for \$199,000. A power lift stretcher system will be installed to accommodate bariatric patients. Adding a 3rd ambulance into the fleet would greatly reduce dependency on the problematic ambulance. Currently, the Township is utilizing a loaner ambulance from Freehold Township as a backup ambulance. The job market for part-time EMS/Fire has grown exponentially and continues to be difficult to staff. The reason the Captain is here is that according to the shared service agreement the Township can provide the Fire District with \$200,000 for EMS Services, with

\$150,000 paid to date and the Fire District will fund the rest of the program through fee for service. In purchasing this ambulance in late 2024, we are going to exhaust our surplus and want to make sure the program remains solvent. We are asking the Township Committee to consider funding the additional \$50,000 that the shared service agreement makes possible so that we have some reserve money in the bank for any unseen expenses. M/Ferro would like to expand the shared services agreement to include mutual benefits for the Fire Department to assist the Township in UCC Fire Inspections. Fire Commissioner Marra discussed the difficulty in staffing and the shared service agreement with Roosevelt Borough. M/Ferro asked each Eagle Scout what their opinion is and should the Township invest the additional \$50,000 into the program. Each Eagle Scout stated that they all agree that the Township should invest the additional \$50,000 into the program. Commissioner McManus encouraged the Eagle Scouts to volunteer with the Fire Department/EMS and highly recommended that the Township continue to assist with moving forward with the additional \$50,000 this year and continue to fund next year this great service the residents are receiving. Captain Maloney discussed the recent EMS response calls within the last two weeks, challenges on staffing and the exorbitant cost associated since COVID. M/Ferro states the breakdown report on the Fire/EMS calls for November as follows: 116 calls which included 77 medical calls, 16 motor vehicle accidents, 23 fire calls and 72 transports to various hospitals. The day shift had 73 calls and the night shift had 39 calls and mutual aid was 24. The Township Committee approves the additional \$50,000.
