EXPLANATORY STATEMENT: This Ordinance revision provides for amendments to the bulk standards of the permitted municipally sponsored affordable housing use in the BP Zone to increase the permitted height of multi-family buildings from 2 stories / 30 feet to 3 stories / 40 feet. This revision is due to the change in programing for the proposed development at 27 Burnt Tavern Road. The development was approved by the Court in 2023 as part of an amended Housing Element and Fair Share Plan that increased the number of affordable units on this site from 49 units to 66 units (plus one additional unit for a property manager). Because of the increase in units and further exploration into the environmental constraints on the site, the required building massing has changed.

He would like to know what the next steps are going to be to preserve the community with everything going on with Adventure Crossing. It is not just Pine Drive, it is also Olde Noah Hunt Rd. M/Ferro stated that a traffic study was done regarding Pine Drive. Some of the options include reducing traffic at the entrance from Route 537 to Pine Drive, making it a one way, including a truck weight limit, and/or a cul-de-sac. Mr. Briceno would like to review the studies. He also stated the traffic is coming from the Turnpike, exit 8 and then turning onto Olde Noah Hunt Rd. to Pine Drive. He suggests that signs should be put up to help direct the traffic to stay on the County roads. Mr. Briceno will reach out to the Township Administrator to get a copy of the studies. M/Ferro stated that additional meetings are required and he will follow up with the Township Engineer regarding an additional request to the NJDOT for a truck weight limit for Olde Noah Hunt Rd.

Michael Marucci, 5 Ella Drive: Stated his concerns regarding the traffic issues on Pine Drive. Vehicles are turning onto Pine Drive from County Rte. 537 and making a U-turn in the middle of the road so they can get to Adventure Crossing. Would like to see some enforcement and would like signs posted indicating no U-turn. M/Ferro stated that the Township will reach out to the NJ State Police.

Nancy Owais, 74 Agress Road: Stated her concerns regarding the traffic coming off Highway 195 and vehicles making an illegal turn left off County Rte. 537 to go into Adventure Crossing or the vehicles turning right onto Pine Drive and making an illegal U-turn.
